Performance Opportunities

The Dance program offers opportunities for students to appear onstage in the program's 622-seat Dance Theatre, as well as additional national and international touring programs. Highlights of the season include the Alabama Repertory Dance Theatre concert, in which students perform works by faculty and guest artists, and a showcase of student choreography, mentored and adjudicated by dance faculty. Other regular opportunities include Capstone projects by MFA Dance students, Yonder Contemporary Dance Company, and participation in the Alabama Dance Festival and American College Dance Association annual conference.

Students earning the bachelor of arts (BA) degree with a major in dance must complete all University, College, and departmental degree requirements. These include the general education requirements, the following major requirements, all requirements for an approved minor, and other sufficient credits to total a minimum of 120 applicable semester hours.
